Purpose & Objectives

The goal of this training is to thoroughly interpret laboratory values that are pertinent to women's health conditions. The correlation of common clinical conditions in women with specific types of white blood cells will be discussed, along with the interpretation of serum protein electrophoresis. Barb will also share the essentials in red blood cell production, common laboratory tests, anemias and other conditions (HELLP syndrome and Eclampsia) that impact women's health.

At the end of this training, participants will be able to:

- List the five mature white blood cells and the one mature white blood cell that circulate in peripheral blood;
- Discuss the functions of each of the white blood cells;
- Correlate common clinical conditions in women with each of the five white blood cells;
- Discuss the interpretation of the serum protein electrophoresis;
- Describe the maturation process of the red blood cell;
- List the essential substances necessary for RBC production;
- List the common lab tests used to determine RBC function;
- Correlate common anemias in women;
- Discuss other common conditions and related laboratory findings in women.

This training will meet Title X, Region V OPA Priority of assuring continued high quality clinical family planning and related preventive health services that will improve the overall health of individuals.

Barb Bancroft, RN, MSN, PNP

Barb Bancroft, RN, MSN, PNP, has provided more than 1400 continuing education seminars on topics pertaining to pathophysiology, physical assessment, and pharmacology to health care professionals throughout the United States and Canada. She has been the keynote speaker for the Association of Practitioners for Infection Control, the National Association of Biology Teachers, the National Association of Orthopedic Nurses, the National Association of Emergency Nurses, and the National Association of Nurse Practitioners. She has held faculty positions at the University of Virginia, the University of Arkansas, Loyola University of Chicago, and St. Xavier University of Chicago. She has provided courses on Advanced Pathophysiology, Pharmacology and Physical Assessment to graduate and undergraduate students. Barb Bancroft is the author of *Medical Minutiae*, a humorous look at the fields of medicine and nursing and *An Apple a Day: The ABCs of Diet and Disease* and the newest release entitled *Live a Little, Laugh a Lot* (August 2003). Barb is a contributing editor to the 1998 edition of *Beare and Myers Adult Health Nursing* (Mosby, St. Louis). She is currently working on *Bite Me: The ABCs of Bites and Disease* and *Shampoos, Tattoos, and Barbeques: The ABCs of Infectious Disease*. Barb is a fascinating and highly informative speaker whose dynamic presentation style makes learning enjoyable. She provides a wealth of clinical information that can be applied to everyday practice.
